



In food companies, registered dietitians are working as leaders in food sanitation supervisory or product development sections.

Our goal is to develop human resources who will become leaders in food and nutrition management for healthy life expectancy in local and global societies.

Access

Two hours transportation from Tokyo Station (Niigata Station on the Joetsu bullet Train)

[BUS] Use "Bandai Guchi Bus Terminal #11" bus stop.

Take the Ogata line.

Get off at "Kenritsu Daigakumae" (Approx. 25 min)

Approximately 3 min walk to the University

[Train JR] Take JR Hakushin line for Toyosaka, Shibata or Murakami

Get off at Ogata station. (Approx.10 min) Approximately 15 min walk to the University.

[Taxi] Approximately 20 min ride from Niigata station.
