<p>This course examines scholarly research that uses quantitative data analysis to study interstate military conflict.</p>			
○授業の概要			
<p>This course examines empirical research that uses quantitative data analysis to study interstate military conflict. Students will read and discuss academic articles that address core research questions in international relations, such as: How do the distribution of power and economic interdependence relate to the onset of military conflict? Why do democratic states rarely fight one another? What factors determine the duration of war? Do peacekeeping operations effectively maintain peace? And have nuclear weapons fundamentally transformed international politics?</p> <p>Prior knowledge of data analysis—particularly regression analysis—is desirable. If you are considering enrolling in this course, you are encouraged to briefly review any of the articles listed below and think carefully about whether this type of research interests you and whether you feel comfortable reading studies of this kind before deciding to participate.</p>
